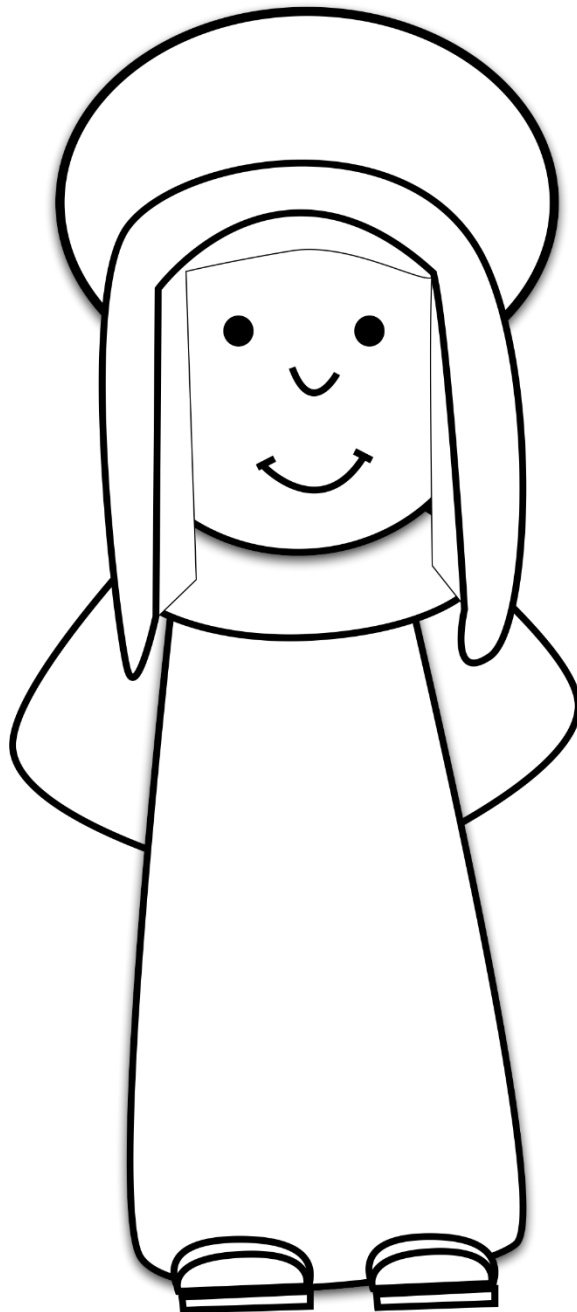


FEAST: AUGUST 11

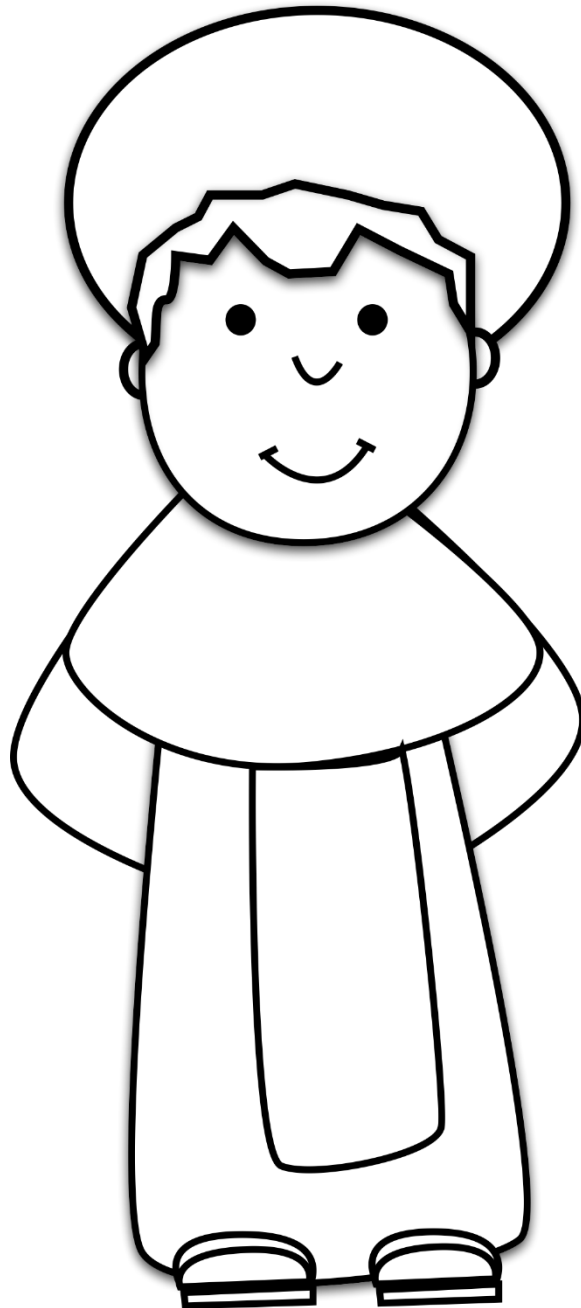


St. Luke
